## **NEW BIRDS IN THE PHILATELIC AVIARY - Charles E. Braun -BU 1364**

About twice a year, J. F. Clements issues a summary of ornithological research that affects his checklist, which we follow in *Biophilately*. The changes from July 15, 2004, that affect birds on stamps are summarized below:

Amsterdam Albatross is now a subspecies of Wandering Albatross (010.001), *Diomedea exulans amsterdamensis*.

Variable Hawk has been split into two species: Red-Backed Hawk, *Buteo polyosoma* and Puna Hawk, *Buteo poecilochrous*. The birds on the two Falkland Islands issues (Scott 307 and 839) are Red-Backed Hawks (030.184).

The English name of *Columba livia* (072.001) has been changed to Rock Pigeon.

The English name of *Columba oenas* (072.006) has been changed to Stock Dove.

The English name of *Ploceus velatus* has been changed to Southern Masked-Weaver. The species has been split into three species, two of which are on stamps:

Southern Masked-Weaver, *Ploceus velatus* (192.041.000) is shown on Botswana, 1982, 303, 1t, Liberia, 1996, 35 cents and St. Thomas and Principe 1983, 731, 3d and 1991, 2500d. Vitelline Masked-Weaver, *Ploceus vitellinus* (192.041.100) is shown on Djibouti, 1977, 463,100 francs, Mali, 1977, 275, 30 francs.and Sierra Leone, 1992 and 1994, 150 leones.

The scientific name of Zebra Waxbill (193.065) has been changed to Sporaeginthus subflavuis.

The scientific name of Locustfinch (193.068) has been changed to *Paludipasser locustella*.

The scientific name of Trunpeter Finch (196.130) has been changed to *Bucanetes githaginia*.

The scientific name of Rufous-naped Brush-Finch (202.245) has been changed to *Atlapetes latinuchus*.

## **New Birds**

The Bicolored Hawk included in this listing was incorrectly identified as a Rufous-thighed Kite in Biophilately 49:1, page 40 and 49:2, page 108. Ironically, the Rufous-thighed Kite need not be removed from the "Aviary" as it appears on a new issue from Surinam to be written up in the next *Biophilately*.



**BICOLORED HAWK,** *Accipiter bicolor* Accipitridae (030.138) Surinam, 1998, 1137, 2.25g

Length: 12 to 15 inches, sexes alike, resident. Slate gray above and paler below with a dark crown and wings and rufous thighs.

Habitat: forests. Range: Southern Mexico to northern Argentina. Reference: del Hoyo, J., A. Elliott and J. Sargatal, Eds. Handbook of the Birds of the World, Volume 2.



**LITTLE SWIFT,** *Apus affinis* Apodidae (084.094) Tanzania, 2004, not yet cataloged, 550 shillings

Length: 5 inches, sexes alike, mostly resident but birds in the colder regions winter in warmer areas. Blackish with a white rump, pale throat and square tail.

Habitat: buildings, gorges and rocky crags.

Range: Morocco to Sri Lanka and sub-Saharan Africa.

**THEKLA LARK,** *Galerida theklae* Alaudidae (122.079) Portugal, 2004, not yet cataloged, 0.58 euro

Length: 7 inches, sexes alike, resident. Brownish above and white below with streaked breast and erect crest.

Habitat: rural scrub.

Range: Southern France to northern Morocco and northern Kenya. Reference: Etchecopar, R. D. and F. Hue. The Birds of North Africa.
