2228	1st (28p)	Pine martin - crustose lichens on tree around den
2231	1st (28p)	Yellow-necked mouse -lichens ( <i>Cladonia</i> sp.?) and mosses on hollow log
2232	1st (28p)	Wild cat - lichen ( <i>Heterodermia-like</i> ) on tree bark
2233	1st (28p)	Squirrel -lichens ( <i>Ramaria</i> sp.?) on branches
