
NEW BIRDS IN THE PHILATELIC AVIARY Charles E. Braun -BU 1364





PIED GOSHAWK, *Accipiter albogularis* Accipitridae (030.110) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1023a, \$7.50 The bird on the left above.

Length: 13 to 16 inches, sexes alike, resident. Slaty black above and white below with a rufous hindcollar. The stamp shows the nominate race, the only race that lacks the rufous hindcollar. Habitat: tropical rain forest, secondary growth, clearings, gardens and near towns. Range: Solomon Islands and Feni Island (Bismarcks). Reference: del Hoyo, J., A. Elliott and J. Sargatal, Eds. IMITATOR SPARROWHAWK, *Accipiter imitator* Accipitridae (030.115) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1023b, \$7.50 The bird on the right above.

Length: 11 to 13 inches, sexes alike, resident. Black with a white belly to undertail. Habitat: tropical rainforest and tall secondary forest. Range: Northern and central Solomon Islands. Reference: del Hoyo, J., A. Elliott and J. Sargatal, Eds. Handbook of the Birds of the World, Volume 2.



HARTLAUB'S FRANCOLIN, *Francolinus hartlaubi* Phasianidae (038.039)

Namibia, 2007, not yet cataloged, nonstandard mail - The francolin is in the eagle's claws.

Length: 11 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is brown above and heavily streaked pale below with a white brow; the female is pale cinnamon brown below with a grayish neck.

Habitat: scrubby hills and ridges.

Range: Namibia and southwestern Angola.

WHITE-FRONTED PLOVER, *Charadrius marginatus* Charadriidae (060.043) Namibia, 2007, not yet cataloged, 30 cents

Length: 7 inches, sexes similar but the female is paler, resident. Pale brownish above, white forehead, collar and below.

Habitat: seashores and along rivers.

Range: Africa south of the Sahara and Madagascar.

GRAY NODDY, *Procelsterna albivitta*Sternidae (068.042) As pointed out by Lois Herrmann, I incorrectly identified this as a Blue Noddy (BP 55:4, page 191). Norfolk Island, 2005, 855, \$1.50

Length: 11 to 12 inches, sexes alike, resident. Gray above and white head and below with a black tail.

Habitat: temperate and subtropical oceans and islands.

Range: Norfolk Island, Henderson and Easter Islands, and Desaventurados Islands (off Chile).

SNOW PIGEON, *Columba leuconota* Columbidae (072.003) The bird on the right Guinea-Bissau, 2006, not yet cataloged, 500 francs

Length: 13 inches, sexes alike, resident.Grayish-brown above and white below with a slate gray head, three black wingbars and a white upper rump. Habitat: rock cliffs in high mountains.

Range: Himalaya, Alai and Pamir mountains.

LAUREL PIGEON, *Columba junoniae* Columbidae (072.013) Guinea-Bissau, 2006, not yet cataloged, 500 francs

Length: 15 inches, sexes alike, resident. Reddish purple above and wine red below with a dark gray face, iridescent green crown and nape and a white-tipped gray tail. Habitat: laurel forest.

Range: Western Canary Islands.

CRESTED CUCKOO-DOVE, Reinwardtoena crassirostris Columbidae (072.081) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1022f, \$5

Length: 16 inches, sexes alike, resident. Purplish gray head with a hairy crest, darker below with brown back, wings and tail. Habitat: forest. Range: Solomon Islands. Reference: del Hoyo, J., A. Elliott and J. Sargatal, Eds. Handbook of the Birds of the World, Volume 4.



STEPHAN'S DOVE, *Chalcophaps stephani* Columbidae (072.091) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1022e, \$5

Length: 10 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is chestnut brown with a white forehead, iridedescent green wings and a vellowish belly; the female is duller with a gray forehead. Habitat: forest and forest edges.

Range: Sulawesi to the Solomon Islands.

YELLOW-BIBBED FRUIT-DOVE, Ptilinopus solomonensis Columbidae (072.250)Solomon Islands, 2005, 1022b, \$5

Length: 8 to 9 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is green with a broad vellow breast band, and a mauve forehead and patch on the lower breast; the female is green with yellow on the lower belly and undertail. Habitat: lowland forest on small islands and above 750 meters on larger islands.

Range: Northwestern New Guinea islands to the Solomon Islands.

RED-KNOBBED IMPERIAL-PIGEON, Ducula rubricera Columbidae (072.276)

Solomon Islands, 2005, 1022a, \$5 The bird on the left on previous page.

Length: 15 to 18 inches, sexes alike, resident. Pale blue head neck and upper breast and reddish brown belly with a cherry red knob at the base of the bill. The stamp shows the Solomon Islands subspecies *Ducula rubricera rufigula*.

SINGING PARROT, Geoffoyus heteroclitus Psittacidae (074.112)

Solomon Islands, 2005, 1021f, \$2.10 The bird on the right on previous page.

Length: 10 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is green with a yellow head and a gray collar; the female is green with an olive gray face and crown.

Habitat: lowland forest, clearings, gardens and parks.

Range: Bismarck Archipeligo and Solomon Islands.

YELLOW-FACED PARROTLET, *Forpus xanthops* Psittacidae 074.259 (Celestial Parrot on the stamp.) Tanzania, 1991, 771j, 75/-

Length: 6 inches, sexes similar but female is paler, resident. Green with a blue-bordered yellow face and blue rump and wing patches.

Habitat: montane desert scrub, dry deciduous forest and riparian thickets. Range: Upper Maranon Valley in north-central Peru.

BUFF-HEADED COUCAL, *Centropus milo* Cuculidae (076.082) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1023c, \$7.50

Length: 24 to 27 inches, sexes alike, resident. Black with buff head, breast and upper back. The stamp shows the nominate race which has a black belly and occurs on Florida and Guadalcanal Islands. Habitat: lowland forest and thickets. Range: Solomon Islands. Peference: del Hoyo, L. A. Elliott and L. Sargatal. Eds. Handbook of

WATTLED SMOKY HONEYEATER, *Melipotes carolae* Meliphagidae (173.137.100) Indonesia, 2006, not yet cataloged, 1500r

Length: 9 inches, sexes alike, resident. Sooty gray with a wattled yellow face patch. Habitat: montane forest andedges. Range: Foya mountains, western New Guinea.

MOTTLED OWL, *Ciccaba virgata* Strigidae (078.109) Tanzania,1997, 1561c, 140 shillings; Surinam, 2006, 1820, Q The Tanzania stamp was written up in *Biophilately* 47(2) but

not designated as a new species. The Surinam stamp shows a dark-morph bird and is a much better representation.

Length: 12 to 15 inches, sexes alike, resident. Brown above and streaked below with brown eyes and a bold whitish brow.

RED-THROATED BARBET, *Megalaima mystacophaenus* Capitonidae (101.011) Maldives, 2007, not yet cataloged, 30 Rf. This was written up in *BP* 54 (2), page 87 for an Eynhallow issue.



BLACK-FACED PITTA, *Pitta anerythra* Pittidae (118.031) Solomon Islands, 2005, 1023f, \$7.50

Length: 6 to 7 inches, sexes alike, resident. bright green above and ochre-buff below with a black and chestnut head. Habitat: forest. Range: Northern and central Solomon Islands. PEMBA SUNBIRD, *Cinnyris pembae* Nectariniidae (166. 078) Tanzania, 2007, not yet cataloged, 1000 shillings

Length: 4 inches, resident. The male (shown om the stamp) is iridescnt green with a glossy violet breastband and black abdomen; The female is greenish graybrown above and creamy below with a white supercilium. Habitat: all habitats.

Range: Pemba Island, Tanzania.

GOLDEN-FRONTED BOWERBIRD, *Ambluornis flavifrons* Ptilonorhynchidae (188.010) Indonesia, 2006, not yet cataloged, 1500 and 2500r

Length: 9.5 inches, resident. The male is a rich brown with a golden orange crown and crest.; the female lacks the crest

Habitat: forest. Range: Foya mountains, western New Guinea. Reference: Beehler, B. M., T. K. Pratt and D. A. Zimmerman. Birds of New Guinea.



DIAMOND FIRETAIL, *Stagonopleura guttata* Estrildidae (193.072) Tanzania, 1991, 771f, 75 francs; Togo, 1996, 1788, 500 francs

Length: 4.5 inches, sexes alike, resident. Brown above and white below with a red



rump, gray crown and nape, black lores and white-spotted black sides and breast band.

Habitat: savanna woodland, grasslands, pastures and orchards. Range: Southeastern Australia.

St. Vincent & Grenadines, 2007, not yet cataloged, \$6

Length: 6 inches, sexes alike, migratory. Brown above and streaked white below with a white supercilium and buff flanks and undertail.

Habitat: woded streams and swamps.

Range: Breeds in the eastern U.S. and southeastern Canada; winters in the Bahamas, West Indies and from Mexico to northern Colombia.
