NEW BIRDS IN THE PHILATELIC AVIARY

<u>Note</u>: The illustrations in this continuing column have not been the best quality for some time. There are plenty of programs available for doing work of this nature but some of us are either not as computer literate as others might be, or had not obtained suitable programs for our computers. I have tried in this issue to rectify the situation, but the scale of the pictures might not be exactly the same as the stamp. Of course, enlargement will help some illustrations, but not others. Hopefully, you will be patient with us while we try to come up with a better product.

Corrections

Glenn Mertz has identified more than 100 discrepancies in bird identifications from various sources. Most of these do not affect our Philatelic Aviary; those that do are summarized below. New species are written up in the main section.

The correct identification of Tanzania, 1994, 1105c, 50s is Brown Snake-Eagle, *Circaetus cinereus*. The identification as African Marsh-Harrier, *Circus ranivorus*, in BP 43 (4), page 247 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Maldives, 1997, 2201, 1r is Crowned Eagle, *Harpyhalietus coronatus*. The identification as Solitary Eagle, *Harpyhalietus solitarius*, in BP 47, page 84 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of British Solomon Islands, 1939, 77, 2/6 is Melanesian Scrubfowl, *Megapodius eremita*. The identification as Dusky Scrubfowl, *Megapodius freycinet* in Handbook 106, page 58 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary. The Melanesian Scrubfowl is also found on Solomon Islands, 2005, 1023e, \$7.50 (BP 56, page 33).

The correct scientific name of the Oriental Cuckoo on Micronesia, 1994, 201a, 29 cents is *Cuculus optatus*, not *Cuculus saturatus* as in BP 44, page 177.

The correct identification on Bhutan, 1989, SS795, 25 nu is Crested Treeswift, *Hemiprocne coronatus*. The identification as Gray-rumped Treeswift, *Hemiprocne longipennis* in BP 39, page 29 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Micronesia, 1991,149e, 29 cents is Caroline Islands Swiftlet, *Aerodramus inquietus*. The identification as Uniform Swiftlet, *Collocalia vanikorensis* (BP 42, page 42) is incorrect and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Bhutan, 1999, SS1266, 100nu is Ward's Trogon, *Harpactes wardi*. The identification as Red-headed Trogon, *Harpactes erythrocephalus* in BP 49, page 94 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Somalia, 1980, 491, 1 shilling is Pygmy Batis, *Batis perkeo* as indicated in Handbook 106, page 152. The later identification as Gray-headed Batis, *Batis orientalis*, is incorrect and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of China (Taiwan), 1997, 3152f, \$5 is Pere David's Laughingthrush, *Garrulax davidi*. The identification as Giant Babax, *Babax waddelli*, (BP 47, page 214) is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of China (Taiwan), 2003, 3509, \$5 is Black-throated Laughingthrush, *Garrulax chinensis*. The identification as White-throated Laughingthrush, *Garrulax albogularis* (BP 52, page 174 and 53, page 18) is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Micronesia, 2001, 465c, 60 cents is Red-billed Leiothrix, *Leiothrix lutea*. The identification as Flame-templed Babbler, *Stachyris speciosa*, is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.


The correct identification of Botswana, 1982, 304, 2t is Miombo Sunbird, *Cinnyris manoensis*. The identification as Southern Double-collared Sunbird, *Cinnyris chalybeus*, in Handbook 106, page 39 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Malaysia, 1997, 608, \$1 is Temminck's Sunbird, *Aethopyga temminckii*. The identification as Scarlet Sunbird, *Aethopyga mysticalis* (BP 46, page 170) is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

The correct identification of Japan, 1976, 1264, 100 yen is Rook, *Corvus frugilegus*. The identification as Large-billed Crow, *Corvus macrorhynchus*, in Handbook 106, page 184 is incorrect, and this species is no longer in the Philatelic Aviary.

Habitat: alpine and subalpine meadows.

Range: Central China.

BAR-WINGED RAIL, Nesoclopeus

Length: 24 inches, sexes alike, resident. Rufous brown above and gray below with yellow legs and a yellow bill, orange at the base.

Habitat: swamps.

Range: Extinct; formerly Solomon Islands and Ovalau and Vita Levu, Fiji. Last reported sighting was 1973.

Length: 12 inches, sexes alike but female has a purple rather than blue iris, resident. Bronzy green head and neck with a white throat, reddish breast patch and buffy belly.

Habitat: primary and secondary forest.

Range: Eastern Philippines: Samar, Leyte, Bohol, Mindanao, Dinagat and Basilan. The stamp shows the

subspecies criniger, which is found on Mindanao and Dinagat.

AMETHYST DOVE, *Phapitreron amethystina* Columbidae (072.188) Philippines, 2007, not yet cataloged, 7p

Length: 11 inches, sexes similar, resident. Brown above with an iridescent violet blue and purple hindneck, reddish buff undertail and white stripe below the eye.

Habitat: forest interior.

PINK-NECKED PIGEON, *Treron vernans* Columbidae (072.191) Philippines, 2007, not yet cataloged, 7p

Length: 10 to 11 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is yellowish green above with a pink neck and breast and tawny orange lower breast; the female is dark olive green above and yellowish green below.

Habitat: forest, forest edge, plantations, bamboo and mangroves.

Range: Southeast Asia to the Philippines and Lesser Sundas.

a pink breast patch and a pinkish-crimson head; the female is all green. Habitat: wooded areas. Range: Peninsular Thailand to Java.

BLACK-CHINNED FRUIT-DOVE, *Ptilinopus leclancheri* Columbidae (072.223)

Length: 10 to 11 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is green with a black chin and a silvery gray head neck and breast below which is a blackish chestnut band; the female is green with a brownish black chin and a narrow dark brown band on the lower breast.

Habitat: forest and dense second growth.

Range: Philippines and Lan Hsu Islands south of Taiwan.

Habitat: forest.

Range: Sulu Islands (Philippines and Borneo) and Miangas and Islands northeast of Sulawesi.







Habitat: arid regions, tree groves and farms.

Habitat: Miombo woodland and open savanna.

TEMMINCK'S SUNBIRD, *Aethopyga temminckii* Nectariniidae (164.120) Malaysia, 1997, 608, \$1

Length: 4 inches, resident. The male (below) has a scarlet head, shoulders, breast and tail, dark wings and a gray belly; the female (above) is gray, paler below, with reddish wings and rounded tail.

Habitat: forests.

Range: Peninsular Thailand to Sumatra and Borneo.

CHINESE GRAY SHRIKE, *Lanius sphenocercus* Laniidae (174.017) China (Taiwan), 2008, not yet cataloged, \$15

Length: 12 inches, sexes alike, resident. Gray above and off-white below with a black mask, wings and tail and white outertail and wing patches.

Habitat: broad valleys, pastures and cultivated areas.

Range: Eastern Siberia to eastern Tibet; winters in Korea and eastern China.

Habitat: forest edges, thickets and bamboo stands.

Range: Luzon and Negros, Philippines.

WHITE-CHEEKED BULLFINCH, *Pyrrhula leucogenis* Fringillidae (194.155)

Philippines, 2007, not yet cataloged, 24p

Length: 6 to 6.5 inches, sexes simillar, but the female is slightly duller, resident. Rich brown above and buff brown below with black cap, wings and tail and white cheeks and rump.

Habitat: moist oak forest.

Range: Northern Luzon and Mindanao mountains.

TAWNY-SHOULDERED BLACKBIRD, *Agelaius humeralis* Icteridae (203.003)

Lesotho, 2007, not yet cataloged, 2.10m

Length: 7.5 to 8.5 inches, sexes similar, resident. Black with a tawny epaulet that has a buff border.

Habitat: open woodlands and rice paddies.

Range: Cuba and northern Haiti.
