A native of Yugoslavia, Montreal artist Ernst Roch has been a creative contributor to Canadian graphic design ever since his arrival in Canada in 1953. In addition to the works he has done for the National Arts Centre in Ottawa, the Art Gallery of Ontario, the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts and the Montreal Olympic Games, Roch has designed several Canadian postage stamps, including the celebrated series on locomotives (1983-1986). He has also served as a member of the Stamp Advisory Committee (1975-1980).

For this set of four stamps on Canadian mushrooms, Roch used gouache to paint his vividly coloured illustrations.

Originaire de Yougoslavie, l'artiste montréalais Ernst Roch évolue dans le monde du design canadien depuis son arrivée au pays en 1953. En plus des nombreuses oeuvres qu'il a produites notamment pour le Centre national des arts d'Ottawa, le Musée des beaux-arts de Montréal, celui de l'Ontario et les Jeux olympiques de Montréal, Ernst Roch a dessiné plusieurs timbres-poste canadiens dont la fameuse série sur les locomotives de 1983 à 1986. M. Roch a également siégé au Comité consultatif sur les timbres-poste de 1975 à 1980.

Ernst Roch a utilisé la gouache pour peindre dans des couleurs vives ce jeu de quatre timbres sur les champignons canadiens.
