Carl was a long-time member of the Biology Unit and his subjects were bees and microscopes. In fact, Carl won the Grand Award at TOPEX in 1991 for his exhibit titled "BUZZ". Carl received the Distinguished Topical Philatelist award at the TOPEX show in 1995. He also served the Biology Unit in many ways: as librarian for many years until 2005; as the compiler of an index for all issues of the journal for many years and also lists of Russian Zemstvos with bees in their heraldic devices and lists of microscopes on stamps. His obituary, which appeared in the Tucson Newspapers on October 18<sup>th</sup>, is on page 106.

The ATA has been searching for a new editor for Topical Time, as the current editor, George Griffenhagen, wishes to step down after serving in the post since early 1992, although he was on the Editorial Board for many years before that.
