I invite that person to share their effort with others in this publication. I promise to make the process as painless as possible. I will take care of all the formatting and text arrangement. All I need is the source data. Please contact me and we will get you started in the next edition.

I invite readers to send me their suggestions for improvement on any aspect of the journal. See the inside cover for contact information. And, as I mentioned previously, I am always looking for articles, letters, and other input of interest to the readers for inclusion in future editions.
