New (not yet numbered):

GUYANA

One miniature sheet of six different mushroom stamps, one miniature sheet of four different mushroom stamps, and two souvenir sheets with one mushroom stamp each. All four sheets have mushrooms in the selvedge.

IVORY COAST

Three miniature sheets of four (two each of two mycologists) and three souvenir sheets (one mycologist each) for a total of nine mycologists to the present: Miniature sheets = (Anton DeBary and Henry Reginald Buller), (Lee Oras Overholts and William Alphonso Murrill), and (Elsie Maud Wakefield and Giacomo Bresadola). Souvenir sheets = Pierre Andrea Saccardo, Fred Jay Seaver, and Charles Horton Peck. Also note that the stamps in the souvenir sheets include one fungus each.

KYRGYZSTAN

Set of four mushroom stamps

MOLDOVA

Miniature sheet of six (three each of two different vignettes): Mushrooms in selvedge at lower left.

MOUNT ATHOS

Single €3.50 stamp in a set of five: Spiny puffball and monasteries.

And for those who like to stretch their collections a bit:

Cocos (Keeling) Islands have issued a sheet of 20 Coral Reef stamps of which one is the mushroom coral in the genus *Funghia*. Not a fungus but a *Funghia* sp.; close enough?
