CASPIAN SNOWCOCK, Tetraogallus caspius Phasianidae

Georgia, 2010, not yet cataloged, 0.5 l

Length: 22 to 24 inches, sexes similar but the female is duller and lacks spurs,

resident. Gray with rufous streaks and a pale head with black neck patches.

Habitat: mountain slopes.

Range: Eastern Turkey, Armenia and western Iran.

SOOTY GULL, Ichthyaetus hemprichii Laridae

Habitat: maritime.

Range: Breeds along the Red Sea and Persian Gulf; disperses to Mozambique and Pakistan.




GUIRA CUCKOO, Guira guira Cuculidae

Habitat: forest, woodlands and semi-deserts.

Range: Australia except Tasmania.

Length: 8 to 9 inches, migratory. The male (shown on the stamp) is speckled brown above and bared below with a white (buffy in the female) collar, wing patches and tail band.

Habitat: open country.

Range: Breeds from the southwestern United States to northern Chile and Brazil; U.S. birds winter in central and southern Mexico.


Length: 6 inches, sexes alike, migratory. Brown with a white throat patch and a forked tail.

Habitat: mainly coastal.

Length: 3 to 4 inches, resident. The male (shown on the card) is green with a violet-blue chest patch and bronzy rump and upper tail; the female lacks the chest patch and has a spotted white throat. Habitat: open areas, forest edges and thickets.

Range: Nicaragua to western Ecuador.





Length: 10 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is brown above and green from the chin to breast with a tuft above the bill and two elongated white wing feathers (the standard); the female is pale brown and lacks the "standard".

Habitat: rainforest.

Range: Halmahera, Kasiruta and Bacan, Indonesia.
