LITTLE WOOD-RAIL, *Aramides mangle* Rallidae (034.068) Brazil, 2004, not yet cataloged, 1.60 reis


Length: 11 inches, sexes alike, resident. Greenish above and orange below with a gray head and a greenish bill with a red base.

Habitat: coastal wetlands.

Range: Eastern Brazil.

AMERICAN AVOCET, Recurvirostra americana Recurvirostridae (057.008) Sierra Leone, 2004, not yet cataloged, 1700 leones This species was previously shown in the border of a sheet from Tanzania.

Length: 16 to 20 inches, sexes similar, migratory. Black and white with an orange-brown head, neck and breast and a long upturned bill.

Habitat: breeds in sparsely vegetated saline wetlands; winters in freshwater and coastal areas.

Range: Breeds in the western U.S and on the east coast: winters on the southeastern U.S. coast, Cuba, and the Bahamas and from California to Honduras.

COMMON NIGHTHAWK,

Chordeiles minor Caprimulgidae (083.007) Mozambique, 2002, Not yet cataloged, 110000 mt - The bird in the surrounds on the right.

Length: 9 inches, sexes alike, migrant. Dark, barred below with white patches on pointed wings and a white subterminal band on a notched tail.

Habitat: open areas and woodlands.

Range: Breeds from Canada to Panama; winters in warmer South America.

BLACK-BACKED WOODPECKER,

Picoides arcticus Picidae (104.120) Mozambique, 2002, not yet cataloged,110000 mt The bird in the surrounds on the lower left.

Length: 9 inches, resident. The male (on the upper right) is all black above and white below with black barring on the sides and a yellow cap; the female (below, left) lacks the yellow cap.

Habitat: northern coniferous forests. Range: Northern North America.

NUTMEG MANNIKIN, *Lonchura punctulata* Estrildidae (193.110) China (Taiwan), 2002, 3447, \$5 This had been identified as a White-rumped Munia in BP 52 (2) page 53.

Length: 4.5 inches, sexes alike, resident. Reddish brown head and above with scaly underparts.

Habitat: open and semi-open country.

Range: India and Taiwan to the northern Philippines and Lesser Sundas.

ST. LUCIA WARBLER, Dendroica delicata Parulidae (199.029.200) St. Lucia, 2004, not yet cataloged, \$1

Length: 5 inches, sexes similar but the female is duller, resident. Blue gray above and yellow below with two white wingbars and yellow around and in front of the eye.

Habitat: forest, forest edges and dry scrub.

Range: St. Lucia, Lesser Antilles.

ARROW-HEADED WARBLER, *Dendroica pharetra* Parulidae (199.039) Jamaica, 2004, not yet cataloged, \$10

Length: 5 inches, sexes alike but female is duller, resident. Streaked head, upperparts and below with two white wingbars.

Habitat: humid forests.

Range: Jamaica.

YELLOW-SHOULDERED GRASSQUIT, Loxipasser anoxanthus

Length: 5 inches, resident. The male (shown on the stamp) is black with yellowish green back and wings; the female is yellowish green above and olive gray below with a pale cinnamon undertail.

Habitat: upland shrubbery.

ORANGEQUIT, Euneornis campestris Embirizidae (202,149)

Habitat: gardens and forests.
