

MAMMALS

The listing in this edition contains four new species, but before this I have listed two older stamps, both of which are noted as new species. Both of these require a little explanation as one is a correction of a previous listing and the other was never listed.

Back in Vol. 35(1), Dave Meixner listed the 3k value (#5389) of a 1985 Russia set as a Thick-tailed pygmy jerboa. Some years later he mentioned to me that he had reason to believe that this identification was incorrect and that the animal depicted was probably a Five-toed pygmy jerboa and if he listed it as such would I do an amended description in my Mammals Biographical column. I would have provided this new description but Dave never got around to including the correction in his listings and so I include the amended identification now. Interestingly I did confirm the new identification at the time. The descriptions on all the stamps of the set are in Russian, which accounted for the difficulty of the original identification. I have a complete set of Grizimek' s Animal Life Encyclopedia and recalled that at the back of each volume every species detailed in that volume was listed in various languages; one of which was Russian. The Five-toed pygmy jerboa was fortunately one of the species mentioned in the text and by comparing the Cyrillic letters on the stamp with those in the listing at the back of the book, I found that they matched. I would also mention that the original identification of a Thick-tailed pygmy jerboa has also now appeared on a stamp and the listing in Vol.52(1) under Mongolia #2497a should be now be noted as a new species.

The second item also involves Dave Meixner as some years ago he brought to my attention a stamp from Russia depicting a scene on Lake Baikal. Around the edge of this stamp were very small silhouettes of various creatures, one of which was the shape of a seal. Dave and I had a rare difference of opinion, as he wished to list this silhouette as a Baikal seal and therefore a new species. While I accepted that this tiny black shape was intended to represent a Baikal seal, I was not prepared to accept that it actually depicted one and we therefore left it unidentified. In 2001, as a Europa issue, Russia provided a further stamp depicting a scene on lake Baikal. To one side of this there are four line drawings of various creatures, one of which is a seal. While this is still only a black on white line drawing of the seal I am far more happy to accept that the seal depicted is a Baikal seal and I therefore list it as a new species. Hopefully at sometime in the future a colour representation of the species will be issued and I will then happily note the fact !
